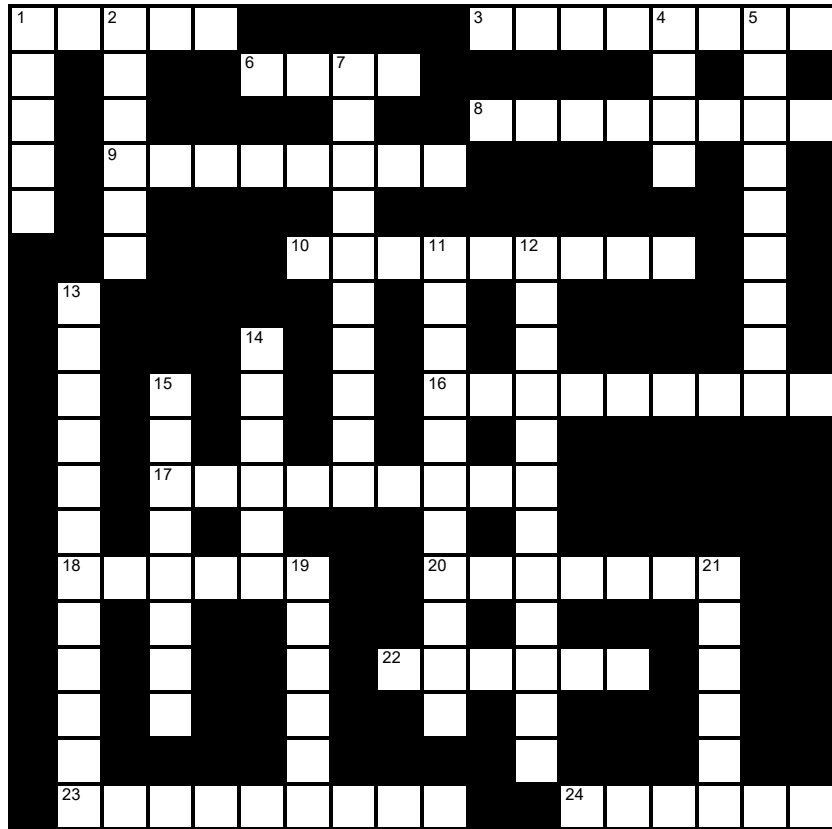

- 14 A prayer form which "lauds God for his own sake and gives him glory; it brings together all other forms of prayer and raises them up to God in heaven (6)
- 15 A movement of prayer by which we dialogue with God, blessing God for his goodness and asking God to bless us by giving us what we ask for (8)
